## **100 YEARS AGO--#3**

## By Wayne Marty

Advertising by local Le Mars businesses filled the latter pages of the early Western Union yearbooks, but that means of support appears to have faded away in the latter 1940s. The 1914 Pilot had 28 ads. Only one of the 28 companies survives yet today and that is the Sentinel Newspaper which included the statement "Inferior Printing is Expensive, no matter how little it costs." There was also an ad for First National Bank but that name disappeared from the Le Mars scene in October of 2013 following a sale of the assets.

The advertising also reveals some changes in culture and business practices. There are several Tailoring ads and two ads that reflect the common combination of "Jeweler and Optometrist"

But even 100 years ago there may have been deceptive advertising, even in the Western Union yearbook. The 1914 Western Union Pilot includes the following full page advertisement but - Is it real or is it a joke?

And now our creative imaginations can begin. A common struggle by students during their college years is drawing the appropriate line between harmless practical jokes and inappropriate vandalism. The extreme claims of this ad suggests that this is a good practical joke. We can find no evidence of a Dillow-Hahn Co-Operative Company in Le Mars in 1914. A freshman, S. M. Dillow, is listed and pictured numerous times which suggests a person with diverse and creative interests – Glee Club, Coronet player in the orchestra, Vice President of the Intercollegiate Prohibition Association, A cleric (theological student), YMCA and Tennis. Hahn was a common name around Le Mars but the name only shows once in the yearbook and that is as a partici-

pant in a tennis tournament. It was common in the

early years to have Western Union students and Le Mars resident non-students joining together on the same athletic teams. I suspect that eligibility rules were not yet in place and games were then played "Just for Fun".

This advertisement for Dillow's Lengthening Compound may have been another "Just for Fun" activity by some creative young people of that era.

## **ALUMNI NEWS**

#### Gene L. Bartley '68 writes.....

I have returned from my journey, which began at Westmar College some 46 years ago, to share a few of my life

experiences through this Newsletter. I must admit, as many other alumni, that since graduating from Westmar I have not been in touch with my classmates, but now that I have officially retired as public health consultant, I have turned back to where it all began. During all those years I have been blessed to reach this stage after working over 25 years in Africa with international organizations as well as working with Native Americans. This article will give a short accounting of my work and those who inspired me along this path whom are gratefully mentioned.

As a blossoming biology student at Westmar College, I had two mentors which I remembered giving me a foundation, and they were Drs. Marty and Divelbiss as well as my roommate, Dr. Paul Selby, who gave me continuing guidance. Outside of the classroom, the extracurricular activities were a nice relief from the normal college routine. Being President of the International Relations Club introduced me to another world. I met students from Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Brazil and Kenya and they put a seed into my mind about working internationally. This seed lead me to become a Peace Corps Volunteer to serve as Surveillance Office for the World Health Organization (WHO) Smallpox Eradication Program in Ethiopia. This effort taught me the strategy of ring vaccination and how to organize community leaders to vaccines susceptible in the area. As a result of our work in Ethiopia,

smallpox was the first disease to be eradicated from the earth in 1977. I owe my inspiration and desire for hard work to my good friend and colleague, Dr. Ciro de Quadros, Smallpox WHO epidemiologist in Ethiopia, who we recently lost to cancer. My love and work in Ethiopia continued for another 3 years teaching science, math and English in rural secondary schools.

Returning from Ethiopia I pursued my educational studies at the University of South Carolina and received my Masters of Public health in Public Health Education. My mentor/professor and friend/ colleague is Dr. William Ward who gave me the support in working internationally. Under Dr. Ward, I was able to work on research projects which lead to the publication of a journal article on pre-post test results of knowledge levels of sexuality education curriculum in the public schools. I enjoy being a student but enjoy more working in the field, which lead me to work as Public Health Educator on the Navajo Reservation teaching prenatal and child health classes in the Health Center in Tsaile, Az. Two different projects which were highlights of my experience were the diabetes & exercise program and distribution of child safety seats. The Navajo reservation was very much similar to my experience in Ethiopia where there existed barriers to available information and access to health facilities.

My international experience has allowed me to work in the Republic of the Congo (Brazzaville), Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, Togo, Uganda, and Zimbabwe and the ability to speak Amharic, the national language of Ethiopia, and French. My first international job was working with the International Eye Foundation in Malawi as Health Education Specialist. This program was USAID-supported project located in the Shire Valley which was to provide health education materials and training in Oral Rehydration Therapy (ORS), insecticide treated nets (ITN) and vitamin A supplement.

The World Health Organization was the first job with the United Nations. I was recruited as Technical Office with responsibilities in Maternal, New born and Child Health, administrative management and budget oversight for activities funded by USAID and DFID grants. In addition, organized and provided administrative and financial management of country and inter-country training courses, meetings and workshops at the regional and county levels. This was a very important area to work in, which effected children and made an impact on those illnesses which most affected those under five years of age, such as diarrheal disease, respiratory infections, malaria, and malnutrition.

Retirement was actually several years ago. Since that time, there have been several opportunities to work as an independent consultant with NGOs, such as Academy for Education Development, as Director of Operations which strengthened capacity building of Africa Institution for Health which was directed by

WHO colleague, Dr. Doyin Oluwole. Again I was called twice to work in short consultancies as Budget and Finance Officer for Child, Newborn and Adolescent Health at the WHO Head quarters in Geneva. In both cases my superiors from previous UN jobs called upon me for expertise, which showed me that they had confidence in me, so, it is important to do your best in all jobs that you hold. I would like to mention that I obtained my PhD from Walden University in Health Services through online courses.

This past year I worked as the Senior Polio Consultant with Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation for high level advocacy in routine vaccination, surveillance and crossborder activities, as well as supervision and monitoring of immunization campaigns in Kenya and Uganda. I was able to provide expertise for the Ministry of Health and Immunization Partners during the period of re-infection of the Polio virus in Kenya in 2013. The major aim was advocacy at the higher levels of government, to increase commitment to have their population, especially under fives, vaccinated. Polio was a disease burden almost 14 years prior to reintroduction in Kenya so the government had to make a renewed commitment which required advocacy by the partners and Ministry of Health. Finally, and most recently, I have been working with the Sabin Vaccine Institute to sensitize the Federal Minister of Health, Ministry of Finance and Economic Development, Health Committees of the Parliament, WHO, and UNICEF to promote a Sustainable Immunization Financing Program in Ethiopia. This program aims at facilitating discussions to create innovative mechanisms by key players and decision makers to increase domestic funding for immunization in light of increased cost of vaccines and the reduced external funding.

In summary, my education and spiritual training, which I received at Westmar College so many years ago, has made a lasting impact in my life. I hope I will be able to reconnect with other alumni in the future as they also share their life experiences in this Newsletter. Lastly, I want to thank those who were responsible for my education during those impressionable years in undergraduate school.


