on fitting the Eagle onto the end of its perch and making provisions for mounting the flag pole in the Eagle's talons. They plan to send all of the support structure parts out for pow-


der coating this week. Terry has completed feathering the leading edges of the wings and will turn to attaching feathers to final section of the eagle - the back of its neck.



Impressions Of First Blackout

'Shadows enveloped the campus as Western Union college went through its first blackout on the night of December 14, 1942. Sirens heard faintly in the distance signaled the approach of darkness and later heralded the return of light to a darkened countryside. Looking out across the campus we saw the piles of white snow illuminated by the moon against a background of dark, perhaps forbidding buildings. We saw old Thoren with its steeple pointing skyward dimly outlined against a darker sky. We saw Dubs, the new gym, and the barracks appearing only as blots against a white background. Looking toward the town the almost ghostly caricatures of houses were seen. One could almost hear a low droon of heavy bombers far in the distance. The moving shadow of an air raid warden was seen as he made the rounds. Turning toward the girls' dormitory, one could hear the Christmas carols which the girls sang as the notes came out through the crystal air. Later the lights flickered and came on brightly. Once again the rooms were lighted, street lights came on, and dark corners lit up with a friendly glow of light.. It was almost hard to believe that two or three minutes ago all was still dark.

Perhaps this dark which covered the campus as well as an area of the Midwest can be likened to the darkness that the world is now in, and lights afterward of the time thereafter "when the lights come on again all over the world."

Scholarship Awards

The Westmar Endowment Scholarship program, managed by the Iowa College Foundation, with input from WAFA are continuing the legacy of Westmar. Three types of scholarships are awarded annually. This year two Presidential awards of \$5,000 each are awarded to incoming College Freshmen with a minimum GPA of 3.0. \$1,000 awards, and \$500 awards are awarded to those of all college grade levels with a minimum GPA of 2.5.

The most qualified students are select according to academic merit, commitment to community service, and leadership qualities. Priority is given to students living in eight Northwest lowa counties and who have a Westmar connected family member (parent, Aunt, Uncle, Grandparent or gr. Grandparent) who were an alumni, faculty, staff, or administrator of Westmar College or its predecessors.

This is one of the largest scholarship programs in Northwest lowa. Since 2001 it has provided over \$622,500 in scholarships. This year \$34,000 will be awarded to 29 recipients – students who will be attending an lowa private college or institution.

Eagle Sculpture cont.



Terry Utesch works on the eagle sculpture. He is the artist/sculptor of this amazing metal eagle. It weighs 1400 lbs., the wingspan is 14 feet. From beak to tail is 6' 8", and the height from talon to wingtip is 5' and talon to shoulder is about 3 feet. It will "fly" 15 feet above the park!!!
