Last fall we received word from Westmar alum, Rev. Dr. DarEll Weist, Class of 1962, that he had just been elected as the Chair of the Heritage Landmark Committee of the General Commission of Archives and History for the United Methodist Church. One of the goals, along with Internationalizing United Methodist Landmarks and featuring more ethnic one's was to also highlight the former denominations within the United

Methodist Church. Of course that includes the Evangelical United Brethren and their predecessors as well.

He encouraged us to apply for designation as a United Methodist Site/Organization within the Iowa United Methodist Conference. We proceeded with the paperwork and have received word that we have achieved that designation!! We have received a plaque that lists us as Historic site No. 543.

We have now decided to apply for the National level designation of United Methodist Heritage Site. We will keep you posted!!

During the Last 100 Years

Stephen Garrington '71 writes:

It has been 50 years since this happened...



If you looked at the freshman class of Westmar College there was one boy who would not catch your attention. He was shorter than most, skinny, and wore a large set of glasses. He had graduated from High School with a C average, and no particular honor or distinction. He signed up for the usual freshman classes including "Earth Sciences" taught by a Korean war vet, Dr. Ebner.

Dr. Gene Ebner was a tall, pleasant, smiling man with a knack for making the complex seem crystal clear. His classes and labs, were not just informative, they were riveting. His explanations, examples and clarity made taking notes and even taking tests a breeze.

When the first test was being handed back the young boy looked at the top to find the capital letter "A" inscribed. Mouth wide open and mind unable to comprehend what had never happened before, he felt a hand on his shoulder. The boy looked up into that caring smile and heard the words, "nice job." For the first time in his life the boy had met someone besides his parents who felt he has worth. And for the first time the boy believed it.

Dr. Ebner saw potential in what the world saw a rather ordinary boy. The study habits and the determination and the joy of educational success flowed into all the young boy's studies. His high school C's and D's became College A's and B's, and 4 years later he would graduate "Magna Cum Laude," thanks to Dr. Ebner.

There followed many honors as the boy grew to manhood, two Master's Degrees, a commission in the US Army, a chance to serve as a responder after 9-11, and even being named Director of Honor Flight of the Quad

Cities. But after each one the boy knew that his success was the success of his teacher. To this day, he thanks the Good Lord for sending Dr. Ebner into his life.

Wernli girls create homes out of rooms

Wernli Hall should be recognized for the creativity that goes into decorating the dorm rooms. When a girl first sees her dorm room, she is confronted with four plain walls. Many Wernli girls have turned their rooms into a home.

Girls have made night stands out of boxes and book shelves out of crates, board and bricks. They have made bulletin boards out of cloth, peg board, rugs, cardboard and even the wall itself. Some such as Pinky McCue and Sue Vinson have rocking chairs to add a "homey" touch to the room.

One room gives the effect of a South Pacific Island. Pat Wyman has a bamboo mat the length of one wall strung with vines. On the floor in front of the mat is a log with plants growing from and draping about the log. A fish net hangs in the corner. Across from it is a lamp three-feet high with colorful tropical fish on it. To finish off the effect, Pat has a live banana tree growing in her room.

The girls in Wernli are good at finding unusual articles to decorate their rooms. For example Lynn Fleischauer has a smashed Ford hubcap hanging in her room. This is very practical. It is cheaper than a Van Gogh or a Raphael piece of art and catches a person's eye just as fast. The room of Kathy Orres and Ruth Ann Milbrandt is a treasure chest of unusual items Among many things they have a gold coated pop bottle, a bronze replica of The Thinker (They have named the work of art Count Your Blessings), the head of a man made from a paper sack, and a cigarette with a match inside a case which reads "Break glass in case of emergency." They also have a list of thirteen ways to be miserable.

Joy Chaffee and Melain Haak have also personalized their room. The Casino Royal (as they call the room) has several corners of interest. One corner has pictures of horses. The car corner has more Cadillacs than any other kind of car. The corner behind the door is called the "sin corner." Here can be found magazine advertisements from almost every brand of cigarette in existence. Among the more practical things are an autographed picture of Captain Jet owned by Candy Nitzschke and an autographed paddle given to Carol Sansgard for protection from boys by her boyfriend, Herb.

First floor of Wernli is the home of the idiot box. The girls' private lounge is decorated with things that torment a dieter—pop machines, candy machines, and a refrigerator. Here the girls may get away from the cares of school for awhile.

The second floor has the special feature of every girls' dormitory—the public lounge. The points of interest of this room do not need to be described.

It's Scholarship Time! Please encourage your children, grandchildren, gr. Grandchildren, nieces and nephews to apply for these scholarships. Last year \$34,000 was awarded to 29 students who attended an Iowa private college or institution.

Last year 2 Presidential awards of \$5,000 each were given to incoming College Freshmen with a minimum of GPA of 3.0. \$1,000 awards and \$500 awards are awarded to those of all college grade levels with a minimum GPA of 2.5.

You do need to have your application and transcript in on time to be eligible. The transcript is your responsibly so do make sure it has been sent from your school in plenty of time.

Applications are online for 2018 – 2019 at <u>www.iowacollegefoundation.org</u>. Click on 'For Students', then click on 'Westmar Endowment Scholarship Application' which takes you directly into the application and description of the scholarship program. Deadline is April 1, 2018.
