'56—Carroll Marty was inducted to the lowa Volunteer Hall of Fame on April 16, 2019. This is the most prestigious state-level honor volunteers can receive; the people selected have freely given their precious time and talent in countless ways to benefit others and have forever changed their community, the state, the nation, or the world. Inductees are recognized during a special ceremony held in the State Capitol Building and their names are engraved on the Volunteer Hall of Game plaque on permanent display in the State Historical Museum. Since the award's inception in 1989, over 175 lowans have been honored.

Carroll, 84 years old, has been an asset to multiple organizations and communities in central lowa which have benefited from his time, talents and boundless energy. Some of his greatest impacts and achievements have been with the City of Ames Parks and Recreation Department, the lowa Gaes/lowa Senior Games, the lowa State University Athletic Department, and Reiman Gardens at lowa State University.

He has been volunteering for roughly 40 years and has increased his contribution since retiring in 2000. Although he has worked on numerous large-scale and scope community projects, he also is a master at finding solutions for smaller needs. At Reiman Gardens, he has designed and installed countless garden display fixtures for indoor and outdoor garden spaces. Since 2007, Carroll has recorded 3,000 volunteer hours with Reiman Gardens and in 2018 he contributed over 600, his second busiest year. He works primarily with horticulture staff to identify areas of need.

Working with the Parks and Rec. Dept., the first project he worked with was a disk golf course which is now named after

him-Carroll Marty Disc Golf Course.

After his morning racquetball or badminton, he can usually be found volunteering somewhere out in Ames until the sun goes down.

Carroll believes that everyone should give back to their communities. Through his on-going service, Carroll continues to inspire others to contribute and become more active participants in their communities. He has helped to educate others and fostered an appreciation of the outdoors, the living environment, and nature for children of all ages.

Scholarship Awards

This year there were 43 applicants for scholarships, and we are pleased to announce 28 scholarships were given. Two \$5,000 Presidential Awards were presented to incoming College Freshmen, with a minimum GPA of 3.0, 20 were awarded \$1,000 each and 6 received \$500 each. These are awarded to those of all college grade levels with a minimum GPA of 2.5. A total of \$33,000 was awarded in scholarships from the lowa College Foundation on behalf of the Westmar University Alumni and Friends Association for the 2019 – 2020 academic year.

Why Donna & Wanda were destined to become "Best Friends"!

(**Donna Jean Houser** '61 listed in Obituaries and **Wanda Powell Schneider** '60

Wanda was born in TX, but grew up in Hutchinson KS and attended an EUB church.

Donna was born in CO, but grew up in TN and Denver and attended an EUB church.

Donna went to Westmar College (an EUB church college) in LeMars, IA in '57 and graduated n '61. Wanda went to Westmar College in '58, after attending Jr College in Hutchinson and graduated in '60. They lived in Wernli Hall and moved to Koth House for a year before Wanda graduated. They both had prepare for teaching careers.

Wanda's senior year, Jefferson County Schools in CO were to have an interview team come to Westmar—Wanda had an interview scheduled, but a snow storm prevented them from getting there. So, Wanda went to Leavenworth, KS to teach for 2 years. Donna went to Jeffco to teach after graduation. Wanda also went to Jeffco after 2 years in Leavenworth and they became roommates.

That fall, Wanda wanted to go to KS to visit her folks and asked Donna to go along. Donna said she'd go if she could go to Newton and visit her great-aunt Eva Mae. Wanda said that name is very familiar. When they got to Newton, Wanda recognized Eva Mae. She was a best friend of Wanda's great-aunt Anna, who also had lived in Newton. Years later, they discovered that Donna's folks and Wanda's dad had all lived in Newton at the same time, but didn't know each other. The minister that married Donna's folks in Newton is the same minister that baptized Wanda in Hutchinson. They also discovered that their ancestors are buried in the same Greenwood Cemetery in Newton. Wanda placed flowers on all the graves when she would go back for Memorial Day.

Donna's grandfather, E. J. Feitz (Mrs. Houser's father) was an EUB minister way back when he would have more than one church and rode a horse to the churches. I went back to my home church for their 100 Anniversary and discovered they were putting up photos of each minister who had ever been at our church to be

placed in the hallway. There was a place for E. J. Feitz. What a surprise! I didn't know he had been a minister at my church. I came back to Denver and got a photo of him from Donna's mother and sent it back to my old church.

Then....A few years ago, a friend found a baby book in a resale shop in Conifer, CO. She couldn't imagine a baby book without an owner. She asked Wanda and her genealogy friend, Jean to help locate a living relative. When Wanda began reading through the book—so much in the book rang a bell. The baby was born in Newton, KS and had lived in both Hesston and Newton. Donna's grandfather had also served as minister in Hesston. And, in reading further, the baby's best friend was Mildred Feitz (Donna's aunt). A living relative of the baby was found in Texas and she now has the book.

Guess there was a real good reason they became "Best Friends".

(Wanda shared her story with us and Donna got to read it before she passed away. They had so many connections.)



Reunion Support Guidelines

Guidelines adopted by the board at the Oct. 2015 meeting:

- Make Westmar Memorabilia available for purchase in the Westmar Room and the Museum sales area.
- Publish reunion pictures in WAFA newsletter if pictures are provided with names and reunion identification.

The lowa College Foundation Selection Committee selects the most qualified students according to academic merit, commitment to community service and leadership qualities. Priority is given to students living in eight Northwest lowa counties and who have a Westmar Connected family member (parent, Aunt, Uncle, Grandparent or great-grandparent) who were an alumni, faculty, staff or administrator of Western Union College, Westmar College/Teikyo Westmar University, Westmar University. The list is then sent to the WAFA office and the scholarship committee goes over the list to verify the Westmar connection. Congratulations to those named above for the 2019 – 2020 year ahead.

Unfortunately, the doors of Westmar closed in the fall of '97. The closing of the University has left a hole in the hearts of many alumni, faculty, staff and friends. However, through the Westmar Endowment Scholarship program, managed by the Iowa College Foundation, we are able to continue the educational legacy of Westmar.

'72—EaVon (Almquist) Woodin was inducted into the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union's girls basketball Hall of Fame on Saturday, March 2 during the Class 2A championship game between Treynor and Grundy Center. Woodin, Waverly-Shell Rock's head volleyball and girls golf coach, accepted the award from Iowa Farm Bureau President, Craig Hill. During her high school basketball career, Woodin played for Pocahontas High School, under the direction of thenhead coach Les Lammers, and tallied 3,061 career points, while also playing in two state basketball tournaments (1967, 1968). During her senior season, Woodin averaged 44.9 points per game and finished with a career average of 31.2 points per game. Woodin played one season of collegiate basketball at Wayland Baptist College in Plainview, Texas, before going to Westmar College in LeMars, Iowa, where she was a five-sport athlete in basketball, volleyball, track, golf and softball. EaVon and her husband Jerry, a local Edward Jones representative, live in Waverly and have three children: Curt, Greg and DeAnn.
