During the Last 100 Years

Images of the Past: The Collectors

The May documentary from South Dakota Public Broadcasting's **Images of the Past** featured personal collections in South Dakota.

They talked with **Bob Kolbe '64**, a Sioux Falls, SD antique dealer in business since 1972. Kolbe's collection of images numbers in the tens of thousands and includes photo prints, vintage post cards and a variety of other media. Kolbe says the collection has an appraised value of "over seven figures." Kolbe's approach to collections is highly professional. He's very particular about knowing everything that can be known about an image and, in particular, knowing who made the image. Although collecting images is more than a hobby for Bob Kolbe, he's still passionate about learning and sharing the stories that old photos can tell. We asked Bob if he could give us more information on his interests since he graduated from Westmar. He writes: When I enrolled at Westmar College I had an inkling that I might go into the ministry. After some reflection, I thought better of that pursuit and changed to a science path. At that time I took the MMPI, Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory. Any question that suggested being nice, I took the other response. Example, if you saw a hurt puppy would you pick it up or kick it; guess which response I chose? When the results came back, it was suggested that I be a research person in a deep cave and not come out but once a year. I took the same test 18 months later and it said I would be OK as a teacher. After that, I followed the science path and taught biology, chemistry and general science in jr. high and high school.

Jane Boegler '66 and I married in 1967 and moved to South Dakota, first to Vermillion, then Sioux Falls. Jane was Head Librarian at Sioux Falls College for 17 years. When SFC and Westmar had sports competitions, I asked Milt Martin about who to cheer for – his advice was to go with the money!

After being unsuccessful in breaking into the Sioux Falls School District, I opened an antique and clock repair shop. We traveled for a semester on Jane's sabbatical in 1981. After 4 months doing the Pacific Rim, New Zealand to Japan, it was back to the shop for me.

For some reason, I fell in love with photographs. The real grabber for me was a postcard series of an execu-

tion of a bandit on the Texas/Mexican border. This appealed to me. Before college I had thought of a history degree but decided I did not want to be a coach or school superintendent as this was the track of a history teacher. Since photographs reflect visual history, I found a passion. There are photos captured all over the world and that is a large area to collect. Narrowing the parameters to Dakota Territory and South Dakota came as a natural. I have become a historian that others ask for information! After 30 years of presenting at history conferences on both ends of South Dakota, I still remember stuff, aging, you know.

Now after almost 40 years of private purchases, photo conventions and eBay; I have amassed a collection of 40-45 thousand images. These are in all formats – real photo postcards (1905-1930), carte de visites, (CDV's are 1860-1890), cabinet cards (1880-1910), stereographs (1840-today) and other various formats. All my photos are pre-digital and pre-computer photo shop. Photographs from 1840 to 2000+/- are a reflection of what the photographer chose to record. We can see what he or she saw then. I can see what was seen by the photographer and 100 years from now, whomever will make their judgement from the same image that I saw.

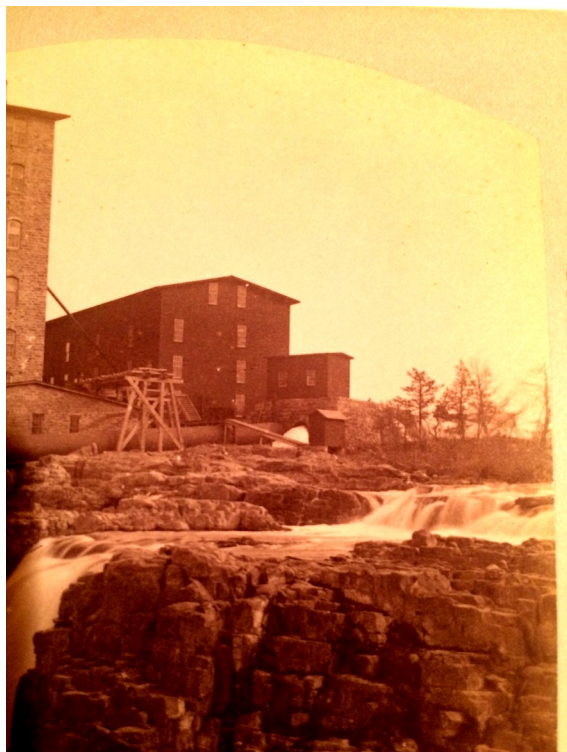

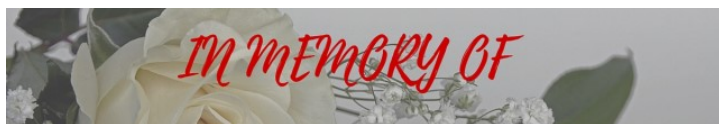

He has lived in New Berlin, WI since 1966 and has impacted New Berlin and the surrounding areas for 50 years.

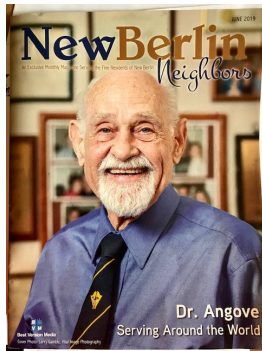
Art was inducted into the US Air Force Air Defense Command, Ground Observer Corp in 1953 while at Westmar. After graduation he taught biology, chemistry and physics for three years. He pastored two churches in Iowa for four years. He then earned his D. O. Degree at Des Moines University College of Osteopathic Medicine in '58.

He did his general surgery residency in Pontiac, Michigan, surgical anatomy at Wayne State University, then he moved to New Berlin in 1966 to be a general surgeon at the New Berlin Community Hospital/Memorial Hospital where he became Chief of Surgery from 1968-1988. Dr. Angove transferred to Lakeview Hospital in Wauwatosa, then to St. Joseph's Hospital in Milwaukee where he currently practices. His wife Carmen passed away in 2002.

In 1957, Dr. Angove started flying lessons and started taking medical/surgical teams to Yucatan and Central American countries. He bought a larger plane and took Medical Missions teams to Yucatan, Honduras, Nicaragua, Belize, Guatemala and Haiti. In 1969 he cofounded Volunteer Intertribal Medicine to provide medical care for the 11 Wisconsin native tribes and bands.

Art and Carmen have 6 adult children, 22 grandchildren and 30 great grandchildren.

Dr. Angove has been on numerous boards and associations as well including: Medical Director for the New Berlin School District; Team Physician for New Berlin West High School; New Berlin School Board clerk; Founding member and Lay Leader at Our Lord's United Methodist Church 1966; Member of the Oakwood Church, Delafield; Chaplain for American Legion Post #488; Board member of the New Berlin Police Citizens Academy Alumni Association; President of the Rotary Club of New Berlin; Senior Citizens Club; Lifetime member of American Osteopathic Association; American Medical Association; American College of Osteopathic Surgeons; past President of the Wisconsin Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons; Trustee Emeritus at Des Moines University; Grand Marshall for the 2019 Commencement; Member of the Wisconsin Medical Society, Credentials Committee and Nominating Committee, House of Delegates; Member of the Academic Physicians Section of the AMA, and Senior Physicians Section; American Osteopathic Association House of Delegates; Milwaukee Academy of Medicine; President of the Christian Kako



Retreat Center, Russian Mission, Alaska; Medical Missions to Kenya, East Africa, Saipan and Taiwan.

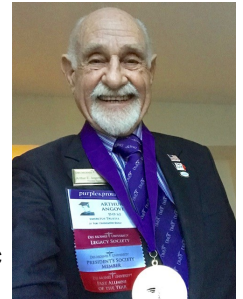
