

The Commission on Archives and History was proud to have the Annual Conference acknowledge the Rev. Edward Johnson '61 as the second recipient of the Lois C. Olsen "Ministry of Memory" award. The Rev. Edward Johnson has been an important supporter of the Archives and its work for more than 50 years. He was a member of the initial Commission on Archives and History that was formed in the Wisconsin Conference shortly after the union that formed The United Methodist Church in 1968. He served on the Commission for years, and also was an integral part of the Wisconsin Conference Historical Society and Museum Committee.

In his early years as a member of the Commission on Archives and History, he advocated Conference wide, and directly with the current Bishop for a separate Archives to house the important records and documents of the Annual Conference. Before our Archives was established as part of the Conference Center in Sun Prairie, the records were scattered around the state, with some in a temporary location

in Oshkosh. The advocacy on behalf of an Archives to house our important records was critical to our Archives being established, and the Rev. Johnson played a key role in that effort.

The Rev. Johnson independently made efforts to preserve as much local church history as possible. From his travels around the state to photograph rural local churches that might otherwise be forgotten, from his efforts to collect and preserve something of their history, and his collection of artifacts and mementos from those local churches, he as been instrumental in building the collection of the Archives. He continued to pursue this passion with years of volunteer work in the Archives itself. Without his efforts over the course of the last 50 years, our ability to tell the story of our denomination to future generations would have been severely diminished. His effort to preserve the history of our Conference stand out and will benefit generations to come.

The Rev. Johnson was unable to attend the Annual Conference held in Green Bay in June 2019, but the Rev. Frank Gaylord received the award on his behalf.

This book was edited by John William (Bill) Armold '55.


My parents are **John J. Armold** '22 and **D'Alta David Armold** '23, both graduates from Westmar. A couple of years ago, I was going through my parents' things, having only slightly perused them many years before. I had failed to realized that my dad had actually written a book. Trying to figure out my dad's handwriting on now yellowed paper was difficult.

About a year and a half ago, I realized what the material was. After considerable editing, I had it published with the title of "Mission Possible: An African Adventure." It is the real life story of my parents' experiences of the first few years in Nigeria, Africa where they were assigned in 1926 as pastor and teacher to a tribe of former head hunters.

Yet as they began their ministry, they soon found themselves transformed into doctor and nurse. In dad's own words, you will follow their sometimes turbulent lives as they fell in love with the people of another world. Some who have read it said they could hardly put it down.

- Make room reservation at LeMars Convention Center, if needed, to get 40% non-profit discount. Pay for room, to be reimbursed by Reunion Committee.
 (Reunion Committee would have to set up and take down the room. Reunion Committee would make alternative room arrangements (i.e. church, restaurant).
- Make Westmar Memorabilia available for purchase in the Westmar Room and the Museum sales area.

Dr. Mitchell had a very successful career as a voice teacher and choral director having 10 former students who are professional singers around the world. He states the best part of his career was, "I had fun doing it." He currently resides in Dell Rapids, SD with his wife Doris.
