Bill Kane '73 has retired after teaching math for 47 years. His first choice was to teach social studies, but he figured there were 2000 applicants for every job. Math, however, had better odds with approximately 200 applicants per job. He has spent the past 44 years at Kuemper Catholic High School in Carroll, IA.



In addition to teaching, Kane has coached 90 teams in six different sports: wrestling, football, boys' basketball, girls' softball, and boys' and girls' track. He's seen his students go on to achieve remarkable accomplishments. He says, "The students have been amazing...whatever they do, they've done amazing things out there."

Kane had a unique approach to teaching math. He says his math teacher was "dry as a piece of toast." He decided the best way for students to learn was to have fun while doing it. He's kept his students entertained with his storytelling and playing some jokes. He says he's always had fun, and he wouldn't have been here this long if he didn't.

That strategy has brought him multiple honors along the way. Now he's ending his career with the announcement that he was selected for an Excellence in Education Award from the Catholic Diocese of Sioux City, IA.

Now that he's entering into retirement, he says his plans are to golf, visit the grandkids and great-grandkids, and head south in the winter. "I don't like the cold anymore. Check Presented in Memory of Husband's Service

Once again, Lorraine Davis of Onawa, IA and a former Westmar student, has given a generous gift to the local Veterans Museum in loving memory of her husband, Leonard Lyle Davis, who passed away in October 1988.

Leonard served in the U.S. Navy aboard the aircraft carrier USS Bunker Hill as a gunner during WWII. Lorraine remembers that on her 24th birthday, May 11, 1945, two kamikaze planes attacked the aircraft carrier instantly killing many. In total, 346 men were killed, 43 missing, and 264 wounded. Although badly crippled, the ship managed to return to Bremerton via Pearl Harbor.

finished her degree at Morningside College in Sioux City, IA and later taught at Mapleton, IA.
