90 YEARS - Not too Bad – Just a “Walk in the Park”

I went ice skating at the Le Mars Park on my 90th birthday. The use of my wife June's walker made it more safe, comfortable, and fun. And while skating, the memories filled my head. I suspect that many can remember incidents at the park during their Westmar College years.

Swimming or skating, depending on the time of year, was common for June and me during our Westmar student years (1949 to 1953) and for many other students thereafter. Spring and Fall were prime times for picnics and parties by the stone shelter houses, constructed in the late 1930s by the WPA (Work Progress Administration). Memory specifics will vary for each individual. Some of mine are John Tuinstra's “You Can Make It Happen” celebration in the spring of his 1975 senior year, and the sad event, during a party in April of 1982, when Bill Lamb was killed by a speeding motorcycle while walking on the park road just one month prior to his intended graduation.

During the Westmar summer session of 1952, June, my wife of 67 years, was taking swimming lessons at the pool when all such activities were suddenly suspended because of the severity of the polio

epidemic in Northwest Iowa (she never did learn to swim), and it was in that park in the spring of 1953 that I gave her our engagement diamond while parked by the pond.

The Pond was the Le Mars swimming pool and well maintained until the late 1980s when the new swimming complex was built near campus on land donated to the City by Westmar. The pond continued to be used for swimming by some who preferred open natural water, but lifeguards and careful maintenance were no longer provided.

Actually, some might recall that there were two ponds: the north swimming pool pond and the south “fishing” pond. The south pond was the dirty (natural) pond but very valuable for the fishermen and nature lovers. When I returned to Westmar as a Biology Professor in 1959, the south pond became an extension of the classroom. Some might recall the Biology and Ecology lab trips to the pond for collection and observation of the many little but important decomposers – snails, worms, etc. that “make the fallen leaves go away.” That south pond is now GONE. The North pond, somewhat neglected after the opening of the new pool, was recently dredged and cleaned up. All the accumulated silt and muddy sand was used to fill and eliminate “my” biology pond, and the south pond space is now a nice camp site facility.

Many hours were spent by some Westmar students on the nearby Municipal Golf course, including the golf teams coached for many years by Dr. Art Larson and later by others. There was no golf for me on that lovely, scenic course, but I spent many hours with the Cross Country teams. I have great memories of the color and excitement of the Cross Country meets held there in the unpredictable Iowa weather – some meets in sunshine and some in pouring rain.

So now the “Walk (or skate) in the Park” is a memory lane, and they are good ones as I remember those many students and faculty colleagues from whom I learned so much. Marty

Seasons of Life



Everyone's life has multiple seasons. For Dr. Devin Stahl, many seasons have focused on Christian-related liberal arts education. Having grown up in rural Boxholm, Iowa, Devin attended Calvary Evangelical United Brethren Church and

Grand Community Schools. Attending Westmar College seemed a natural progression in that he was following in the steps of his extended family, church friends, and teachers.

While at Westmar, Devin sang in the Chorale and was a member of the first choir to tour Europe in June 1969. He was also a member of the Westmar Quartet performing on campus and touring the Midwest each summer. He regarded it as a privilege to visit the homes and churches of many of the college's current and potential students.

Following his 1971 Westmar graduation, Devin attended Wichita State University earning a Master's degree in 1972 and a PhD from Kansas State University in 1978. His dissertation was a status report of Christian liberal arts colleges in the United States. Dr. Stahl entered the field of education as a classroom instructor for seven years before becoming a building administrator and superintendent of schools. In addition to these responsibilities, he served as a graduate school adjunct instructor both at Kansas State and Washburn Universities. He was named Westmar Educator of the Year in 1994.

Having been an educator for 26 years, in 1997, Devin embarked on a new career in financial services. He was a Prudential representative for seven years where he was recognized nationally and internationally for his production and service. Devin founded Star Financial in 2004 serving as President for the next 12 years. He created a niche practice for clients who never experienced a downturn in the market by investing in high quality fixed and indexed opportunities. In 2015, he sold his practice.

In addition to his career experiences, Dr. Stahl served on the state board of Kansas Children's Service League, an advocacy and adoption agency. He was a member of the

the board of education for the Wichita Independent School, a private college prep school, and was president of the Wichita Children's Choir, an audition only children's choir that has received national acclaim. Dr. Stahl sang for 10 years in the Wichita Chamber Chorale, a professional choir that performed throughout the region and an international tour of Russia.

Dr. Stahl credits Westmar with his introduction to travel. He has toured over fifty countries on six continents with each providing unique insights and cultures. He is an avid reader in retirement and has become an author having written five fiction and non-fiction books. Free copies of his works are available at the Westmar Alumni Office.

Dr. Stahl's commitment to Christian liberal arts education has been a thread that has been interwoven into his life. While President of Star Financial, he began awarding Star Scholarships. This year, he endowed one million dollars to be shared equally by Southwestern College, a Kansas United Methodist college, and Friends University. Scholarships are awarded to premed, education, and fine arts students. Each year, fifty thousand dollars in scholarship funds will be awarded for perpetuity.
