Rev. Martha Hicks Touchton '85, of St. Mark's UMC, received the 2022 Rutherford ATHENA Award. The ATHENA Award recognizes an individual who excels in her profession, gives back to the community, and helps raise up other leaders, especially women. Touchton was honored at a luncheon held April 29, 2022 in Murfreesboro, TN.

Touchton said in her ATHENA essay that she represents the ATHENA Leadership Model by living authentically, building relationships, giving back, fostering collaboration, courageous acts, life-long learning, fierce advocacy, and celebration and joy as a female member of the clergy.

Touchton said, "Often I must defend my gifts, call, and ordination with kindness and grace. It is by using the ATHENA attributes of relationships, collaboration, and courageous acts that I am able to serve as an effective leader in my personal and professional life."

Touchton serves as the Minister of Education at St. Mark's United Methodist Church, where she directs Christian education, adult, children, and family ministries, and leads in worship, congregational care, and spiritual formation.

Alumni, Instead of Stork, Make Flight

Last November, five alumni of Westmar College went on an adventure that they never dreamed, in their college days, would happen. They joined a group of 56 couples from lowa, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Minnesota, Wisconsin, and California to charter a turbo-jet airliner for a flight to Korea. The purpose of the trip was to arrange for the adoption of 83 Korean orphans.

This was an historical event in two respects. Never before had there been a mass flight of this nature overseas to arrange for the adoption of foreign children. During the flight over the Pacific, a church service was held aboard the plane. This also was a first, and Rev. and Mrs. Laurice Streyffeler conducted the service. Rev. Streyffeler is pastor of the Evangelical United Brethren church in Renwick, lowa.

When the 56 couples arrived at the Holt Orphanage in Korea, they were directed to several different buildings to call for their children. By coincidence, the children of all five Westmar alumni, the Laurice Streyffelers, the Carroll Martys, and the Clarence Westphals, were waiting in the same room. Words fail to adequately describe the events which transpired that afternoon. It seemed as if the sky had opened and heaven had come down into that little room. Elaine Marty, with tears of joy running down her cheeks, was clutching her little daughter to her breast; Jennie Streyffeler and Marion Westphal, their eyes like stars, were hugging their little ones, which they had finally found after months of waiting and uncertainty. Those who participated in this joyous occasion will undoubtedly recall it many times during their lives. All of the children adopted by the 56 couples who made the Korean trip were abandoned children. The rice famine of the past year had resulted in a great deal of suffering and in some instances, mothers took their children to the Orphanage because they did not have enough food to keep them alive. Most of the Holt orphans, however, are American Koreans, children of G.I.'s who are despised by the average Korean. These outcasts are often stoned and frequently killed. For most of them, their only future in Korea is to become beggars or thieves.

The Streyffelers, the Martys, and the Westphals brought back with them five Korean children: the Streyffelers, a boy and a girl, Kurt Alan 2 1/2 years and Laurie Ann, 8 months; the Martys, two girls, Brenda Joy, 2 1/2 years and Lana Kay, 9 months; and the Westphals, one girl, Kimberly Lynn, 3 1/2 years.

Harry Holt of Crewsell, Oregon, who operates the Holt Orphanage, is a former wealthy west coast lumberman who has given most of his fortune to this humanitarian work. His wife is his enthusiastic partner in promoting the adoption program. Although they have six children of their own, Mr. and Mrs. Holt adopted eight Korean orphans and through their efforts have placed over 3000 Korean children for adoption in America.
