Marilyn has attended more MSBA training sessions than any other school board member in Minnesota, the most since MSBA has been keeping records of training attendance. She has served as liaison to all schools and on nearly every school community committee, council and task force that exists.

In addition to serving on the SLP School Board, she currently serves as the Chair of Northeast Metro 916 Intermediate School District, 916's representative to the Association of Metropolitan School Districts, is a member of the board of her church's school and child care center, is a member on the 7 county IEIC Help Me Grow board, and is secretary of her homeowner's association.

Marilynn has received all awards and honors available from the Minnesota School Boards Association (MSBA) - Director's Award, President's Award, 40 Year Service Award, Arlene Bush School Board Member of Distinction Award, and Minnesota School Board Member of the Year (MSBA All-State School Board). She has served as chairperson of the Association of Metropolitan School Districts, vice chair of Equity Alliance (EMID), on the MSBA Board of Directors and on the Panther Foundation Board of Directors. She was once honored with WCCO Radio's Good Neighbor Award for her volunteer work.

Marilynn is a 1959 graduate of Westmar University and a retired medical technologist. She began her "school career" as a paraprofessional at Spring Lake Park Schools Kenneth Hall Elementary School.

Alumni News



On November 4, 2022, The Le Mars Sentinel had a headline, with a picture, stating "City-owned YMCA Annex building declared surplus property." My first thought was that the old building has been surplus before - just 75 years ago. After WWII, Western Union College acquired nine surplus "barracks" buildings that were declared surplus as the activity was reduced at the Sioux City Air Base.

A two story "barracks" building was combined with one single story building to make the L shaped "Old Science Building" that was occupied and first used in the Fall of 1947. Biology, Chemistry and Physics classes and labs had previously been located in Thoren Hall. The Biology Department moved into the upper floor, and Physics into the lower floor of the two story portion and the single story wing provided space for Chemistry laboratories and a shared lecture room. Some will also remember the well-equipped Hershberger Dark Room at the bottom of the spiral stair case at the north end of the Chemistry Lab.

After the new Kime Science Hall was constructed in 1967, the building transitioned at various times, into use by Development, Psychology, Mail Room, Admissions Office, Financial Aid Office, and Education. The entire building was demolished in February 2002 after Westmar closed in November of 1997, so it was used for 50 years and only stood idle a few of its last years.

Five single story "barracks" were used for married student housing - "the huts" - as the WW II Veterans were released from service, getting married, starting their families, and funding their Education through the GI Bill of Rights. Each building contained two apartments so housing was provided for 10 families, and they were located south across the street

from the Memorial-Koehler Men's Dormitories. They were also scheduled to be occupied in the Fall of 1947 but lack of plumbing fixtures delayed occupancy and many had to find temporary housing for a few months. All of these "huts" were demolished in the 1960's when Westmar was growing and new buildings were being constructed, including the married student apartments that are still being used now, 25 years after the college closed.

Two single story "barracks" buildings were combined into a T shaped building and began its use for Industrial Arts in the Spring Semester of 1948. The Top of the T to the east provided space for drawing and drafting and the Leg of the T provided space for the Wood Construction projects and finishing. The drawing and drafting portion of the building was demolished in the 1980's to make room for the construction of the Wellness Center. CAD (Computer Aided Drawing) was booming, and Robotics was rapidly changing the Industrial World.

Funds were shrinking at Westmar, and the Industrial Arts Department was phased out in 1991. At about that same time, Tarkio College from Missouri had closed and many Faculty and students from their well-known Drama and Dance program became part of Westmar. Hard wood floors and railings and glass mirrors were installed in "the Old Wood Shop" for Dance Instruction. This use continued until the college closed in 1997, and then it became an Annex building for the YMCA and Le Mars Recreational Program. The last remnant of the 1946 surplus buildings is now SURPLUS AGAIN! It has served well.
